



Code of Conduct

Substance-Free Environment

The consumption of alcoholic beverages and narcotic drugs is strictly forbidden throughout the duration of the FDRMUN conference. Our commitment to a substance-free environment extends to all venues and social events associated with the conference. Smoking is allowed only in designated areas. These locations are clearly marked for your convenience. We ask that you respect this rule to ensure the comfort and health of all attendees.

The use of chewing gum is discouraged during formal sessions and in conference rooms to maintain a professional atmosphere.

Technology and Communication

Mobile phones must be switched to silent mode during all sessions and meetings. This is crucial to prevent disruptions and to maintain the decorum of the conference. Participants are encouraged to limit their use of electronic devices to breaks and non-session times unless the device is being used for conference-related activities.

Facilities and Resources

FDRMUN will provide computer and printing facilities for resolution drafting and amendments. Participants are required to bring a USB memory stick to save their work. For effective lobbying and preparation, bringing a laptop is highly recommended, especially on the designated days for lobbying.



Code of Conduct

Dress Code

In keeping with the tradition of formal diplomacy, all delegates are expected to dress in a manner that reflects the seriousness of the United Nations. This means formal attire for all sessions.

Men are required to wear suits, shirts, and ties. Jeans and casual wear are not permissible. Women should wear formal suits, dresses, or skirts with blouses. Skirts should not be shorter than slightly above the knee, and revealing attire is not appropriate. Formal shoes are mandatory for all; sneakers and casual footwear are not allowed. Delegates not adhering to the dress code may be denied entry to the conference sessions.

Identification and Access

Upon entering the parliament on the first day of the conference for the opening ceremony, delegates need to be identified via their FDR boardingpass. Administrative staff members will then scan each individual's FDR boardingpass and be directed towards their assigned counters. Delegates will then be given their designated badges, which can only be made with a copy of their ID. Delegates must not lose their badges, as they cannot be reissued without a fine. The cut-off for badge retrieval is at 10am on the 17th.



Participation Details

FDRMUN Newspaper

The FDRMUN Press Team, consisting of journalists, photographers, and a film crew, will publish a daily newspaper to cover the conference's progress, debates, and committee resolutions. This newspaper will also feature interviews and opinion pieces. Delegates are encouraged to contribute articles or opinions to the FDRMUN newspaper. This is a great opportunity to voice your perspectives and report on the conference's developments.

Transportation and meals

Select international participants will be provided with a public transport ticket, valid for Zones 1-11. It is essential to validate this ticket on the first morning of the conference for it to remain valid until the last day.

We encourage participants to bring their own packed food and snacks. While eating in the conference rooms is not permitted, there are designated areas where you can enjoy your meals.



Participation Details

What to expect

Upon entering the parliament on the first day of the conference for the opening ceremony, delegates need to be identified and given access to the palace, via their FDR boardingPass. Administrative staff members will then scan each individual's FDR boardingpass and be directed towards their assigned counters. Delegates will then be given their designated badges, which can only be made with a copy of their ID. Delegates must not lose their badges, as they cannot be reissued without a fine. The cut-off for badge retrieval is at 10am on the 17th.
